## Why sustainable cities & communities are relevant to child rights?

Due to a lack of urban planning and uneven urban development, millions of children in urban settings confront daily challenges and deprivations of their rights.

### United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child



#### ARTICLE 6

Every child has the rights to life, survival & development.



#### ARTICLE 12

Children can give opinions and expect them to be heard.



#### ARTICLE 23

If a child lives with disability, she/he needs care & support to live a full life.



#### ARTICLE 24

Good health, clean water & nutritious food are a child's right.



#### ARTICLE 27

All children must have their basic needs met, no matter how disadvantaged or marginalized.



#### ARTICLE 31

Children have the right to play and rest.



## Actions to take

### 11 SUSTAINABLE CITIES AND COMMUNITIES



Reduce carbon footprint and traffic jams for a more sustainable environment, e.g. ride on bike or walk.



Promote the natural heritage of Hong Kong. Take photos and share the beautiful views through social media.



Promote the concepts of child-friendly and inclusive playgrounds. Organize workshop for children in your community. Let them voice out and create their ideal playgrounds.



Reduce waste by recycling and upcycling, e.g. place recycling bins on the floor you live and encourage your neighbours to use it.

由於缺乏城市規劃和城市發展不平衡，數百萬兒童面臨著生活中的挑戰和權利未能實踐的問題。

## 聯合國 兒童權利 公約



### 第6條

兒童有生存和發展的權利。



### 第12條

兒童有權發表意見，並獲得尊重。



### 第23條

如兒童有殘疾，必須得到特別照顧，讓他們亦有充實的生活。



### 第24條

健康的身體、清潔食水和有營養的食物，都是兒童的權利。



### 第27條

不論貧困或弱少，所有兒童必須享有基本生活所需。



### 第31條

兒童有權遊戲和休息。

11 可持續發展  
城市及社區



減少碳足跡和交通擠塞以達致可持續的環境，例如騎單車或步行。



推廣香港的自然遺產，例如拍照並透過社交媒體分享美麗的景色。



推廣兒童友好和共融遊樂場的概念。為社區的兒童組織工作坊，讓他們發聲，創造其理想的遊樂場。



透過回收和升級再造來減少浪費，例如：在你居住的樓層放置回收箱，並鼓勵鄰居使用它。
